## EXHIBITOR TIP!

**ELIGIBILITY:** Any recognized school of the Montana Superintendent of Public Instruction is eligible to participate on a space available basis. Preference will be given in the following order: 1<sup>st</sup>-Schools that participated in the State Fair in 2009; 2<sup>nd</sup>-Rural schools; 3<sup>rd</sup>-Great Falls schools

Daily hands on activities may include: edible art, origami, and paper mache.

### General Rules

- All participants at Montana State Fair events are responsible for reading the General information section of this handbook and complying with policies listed therein.
- AGREEMENT TO ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS HEREIN STATED IS UNDERSTOOD WHEN THE EXHIBITOR SUBMITS THE ENTRY FORM.
- All entrants must complete a W9 form at time of entry to receive premiums.**
- Adults responsible for the display may purchase one exhibitor's pass for \$25, which includes 10 adult admissions and/or a vehicle. Youth 6-18 years may purchase a \$20 exhibitor's pass that includes 10 admissions—no vehicle.
- All possible care will be exercised by State Fair in handling exhibits, but no responsibility for loss or damage in transit or during any phase of the exhibit will be assumed by State Fair.
- Displays should offer representation from the entire school, K-12.
- All projects displayed must have been developed during the 2009-2010 school year to qualify for ribbons.
- Display areas will not be encased. Each participating school will be notified by mail of display area size and display equipment available.
- Each school is responsible for transporting, setting up, taking down and removing their displays at Montana State Fair by the dates and times listed.

### JUDGING:

- Individual works submitted by students will be judged on quality of project, neatness, etc. Ribbons will be awarded on merit.
- Group projects submitted by grades will be judged on overall quality, neatness, etc. Ribbons will be awarded on merit.
- Individual and group projects will be judged on their own merit and not compared from one school system to another.
- Displays will be judged for overall effect. Rosettes will be awarded as merited.

**Division 1 & 2 exhibits must be labeled with Name, Grade, School, & Media .**
